S. (SHADE)(SHADRACK) MYERS - born 1840, 3 miles south of Brandon, near the present Bethel Baptist Church; died April 6, 1861, at the Battle of Shiloh where he was a Private with Company A., 6th Regiment, Mississippi Infantry, Confederate States of America. This excerpt from a Civil War history, copied by Margie Riddle Bearss, reads as follows:

"The 6th Mississippi Regiment was under Col. John J. Thornton and it was put into the 3rd Army corp with other Mississippi troupes. General W. J. Hardee was in command.

Hardee's corp was in the Confederate advance from Corinth, Miss. to Pittsburg Landing, Tenn., near Shiloh. The Union troops were camped there. Union troops were awaiting reinforcements from General Buell via the Tenn. River. The Confederates under General A. D. Johnson, supreme commander, decided to attack before reinforcements arrived and in secrecy so it would be a surprise attack. During the night of April 6, 1861 the armies camped within a short distance of each other - the Confederates poised ready for attack and the Yankees unsuspecting. The battle began about 4:55 A.M. Sunday, April 6 when a reconnoitering party from Prentiss' Union division ran into Hardee's skirmish line. The battle started with Hardee's men (including the 6th Miss.) standing the first shock of the enemy. After this there were two days of bloody battle which raged around the old Shiloh church near Pittsburg landing.

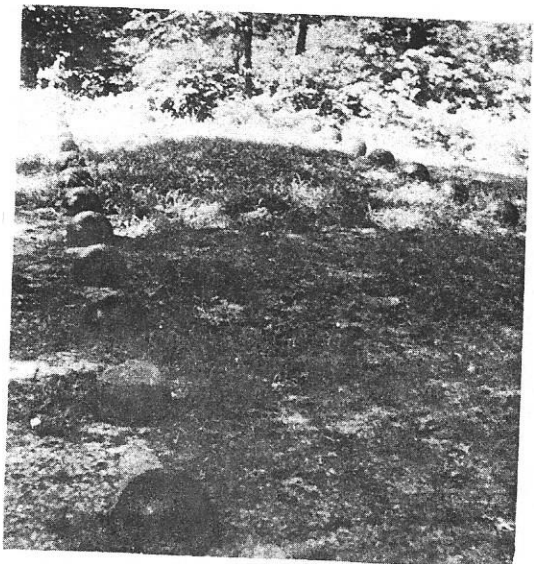
The 6th Miss. Regiment played a brave though fruitless part. From Col. Cleburn's report about the 6th Miss. we have the following: "They came under a very destructive fire, and though the 6th Miss. charged through the enemy enca,pmnts, they suffered a quick and bloody repulse. But again and again, unaided, the 6th Miss. charged the enemy's line and it was only when the regiment had lost 300 officers and men out of 425 that it yielded and retreated in disorder over its own dead and dying."

Colonel John J. Thornton and Major Robert Lowery, the field officers, were both wounded as well as Captain E. L. Alford and W. J. French,

"It would be useless," Cleburn reported, "to enlarge on the courage and devotion of the 6th Miss. The facts, as recorded, speak louder than any words of mine."

After the first bloody charge the rest of the command reformed and remained in the battle until afternoon when Captain A. Y. Harper, commanding the remnant of the regiment marched it to the rear. Its terrific loss in the morning, the want of all its field and most of its company officers, had completely demoralized it and unfitted it for further service."

The battle was lost for the Confederates when reinforcements came to the Yankees during the night. The Confederates retreated leaving their dead on the field but trying to take their wounded. The Yankees buried the Confederate dead in mass trenches, because of the rain and heat. There are three mass graves. One holds 700 unidentified Confederates. It is presumed that Shade was killed during this first morning's fighting since the 6th Miss. took no active part later, or else he was brought wounded back to Corinth.

DANIEL MORGAN MYERS - born March 25, 1845, son of Carmen Myers and Martha Purvis Myers of Scott County. He married Nov. 7, 1868, Mary Elizabeth Tullos, daughter of Vinson Tullos and Sarah Frances Runnels Tullos of Smith County.

He served in the Civil War, in Company M, 12th Miss. Cavalry, Armistead's Regiment. He was enlisted April 2, 1864, Brandon, Mississippi, sworn in by Captain Maxey with age given as 17 years. He was transferred in 1864 to Company L, 12th Miss. Cavalry. He was a member of C. L. Armistead's Cavalry commanded by Col. W. P. Maxey, surrendered at Citronell, Alabama by Lieut. General R. Taylor, CSA, to Major General C.R.S. Canby, U. S. A., May 4, 1865. After he was mustered out of the Army at Vicksburg in 1865, he returned to his father's home near Brandon where he was married a short time later. He died March 15, 1885, buried near Galilee, in Smith County. Two children were born :

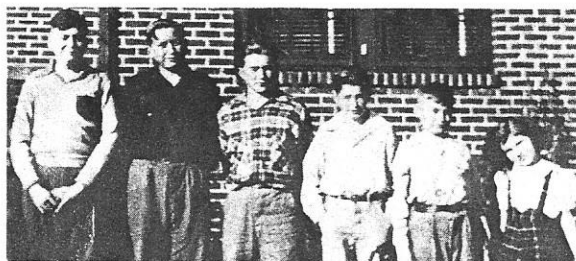

JOHN MILES MYERS - born march 9, 1848, Scott County, Miss., came with his parents to Rankin County as a child and remained until his death in 1933. 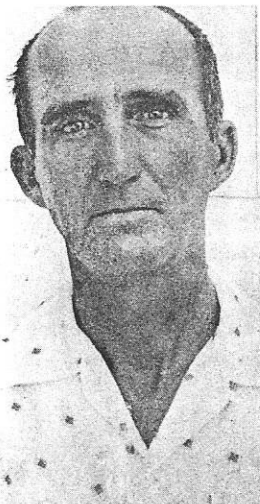

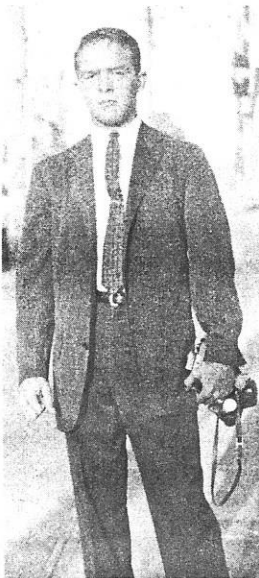
