JAMES MONROE MYERS - son of Carmen and Martha Purvis Myers was born November 2, 1851, in the plantation home of his parents, four miles south of Brandon, in what is known today as the Bethel community. Born into a family of 12 children, Jim grew up to a life of ease, for his father owned many slaves and much land in the county. His bodyguard and playmate was a slave boy also named Jim.

At the age of 18 years Jim was married to Sarah Frances Tullos, thirteen-year-old daughter of Vinson (Jack) Tullos and Sarah Frances Runnels Tullos, of White Oak community of Smith County. As a wedding present his father gave him a new log house, erected by his slaves, a tract of land, a team of mules with wagon and a sum of money as was customary in those days. Jim became a master farmer and never moved from this home that stood for 90 years in the Myers community. In 1910 he gave an acre of land to be used for a cemetery for the Bethel Church which was being erected near by. His was the first grave to be made in the soil that became the last resting place for his entire family and their descendants with the exception of two, Granddaughter Mary Lula Myers (Jones) and Great Grandson John Weems Parker. He was a deacon and a charter member of the new Bethel Church of 1910. He was the father of six children as follows:

SAMUEL RANSOM MYERS - born Oct. 6, 1871, three miles south of Brandon, Miss., died July 27, 1932, Bethel community, Brandon, Miss., was a farmer and an educator. He attended Old Hebron School, in Rankin County, the Brandon Male Academy and Mississippi College after which he began a teaching career that ran for quite a number of years. In 1903 he was elected Rankin County superintendent of education, a position he held for nine years, the first year being the unexpired term of Charlie Cook. After running for a seat in the House of Representatives and being defeated, he retired to his Sunny Brook Farm, south of Brandon, where he spent the remaining years of his life, expiring in 1932, of a heart disease. He helped to organize and build and was a charter member of the Bethel Baptist Church, built in 1910, where he held a number of offices in the church and Sunday School over a period of 25 years.

He was married, Feb. 24, 1898, to Fannie Dorinda Cooper, (Aug. 6, 1878 - Dec. 2, 1955), daughter of Napoleon Bonaparte Cooper and Zilpha Martin Cooper, of Cherry, Miss., in a double ceremony when his brother, James Caz Myers took Zanie Emma Cooper, also a daughter of Napoleon Bonaparte Cooper and Zilpha Martin Cooper, to be his bride. 
